

After the Storm Bracelet Kit



Contents:

- 60 cm fine gold chain
- 30cm leaf chain
- 1 large lobster clasp
- 4 brass organic 0.5mm doughnut beads
- 2 large oval beads
- 2 small oval beads
- 1 organic hammered circle link
- 20 eye pins
- 18 jump rings
- 1 bag of seed beads



* Please note there are a few spare beads included

Prepare all your materials ahead and lay out before assembling.

You will want it to be made of interesting sections so when worn as a wrapped bracelet it will look like a bracelet stack, this also doubles up as a great long profile or wrapped necklace!

1. Cut the fine chain into 3cm lengths.

You will have enough for 20 pieces



*Please have a look at our YouTube channel for more detailed instructions on how to pin and loop beads if you have never done this before for Step 2.

2. Pin and loop the seed beads.

Thread on the beads, and bend the pin using *flat nose pliers*.

Cut the pin about 1cm from the bend, and create a loop using *round nose pliers*.

You can place the beads on the pins randomly or make a pattern. We have made two patterns for ours so it will create two different looking sections when worn.



3. Now make sections from your leaf chain.
The example from our original image has been cut as follows:

7cm x 2 pieces
18cm x 1 piece

4. Link 3 doughnut beads with jump rings, followed by one large oval link.



5. Link one 7cm length of leaf chain to 1 small oval, 1 hammered ring, followed by another 7cm length of leaf chain and 1 large oval.



Join the small 3cm chains to the pinned and looped seed bead sections, creating a long chain with beaded stations.

We made one length with our red/orange/yellow beads and one length with our blue/green yellow beads.



6. You're now ready to assemble all the parts. We have linked ours as follows:

Fine chain with red/orange/yellow - one end linked to a small doughnut and the large lobster clasp. The other end of this section is linked to the 2x7cm leaf and ring section

We've attached the 7cm leaf section to the 2nd fine chain with blue/green/yellow stations. We've attached the other end of this chain directly to the 16cm leaf chain section

We've attached the link doughnut section to the end so that the last link is the large oval. The clasp can be **closed onto the oval link at the end.**



Twist liberally, it is easiest to put on starting with the large oval - then twist along and if necessary you can cross over the last length of fine chain with the lobster clasp to close.

If you're wearing this as a necklace have your lobster clasp at the front as a feature

Difficulty level – medium

Time to complete – 2 to 3 hours
