

Memory Wire Bracelet Kit



Contents:

- 12 coil pack memory wire
- 130-150 assorted beads

* Please note there are a few spare beads included



1. Unwrap 6 rows of memory wire and cut (ideally using memory wire cutters as side cutters will damage quickly if used for this kind of wire).

2. With your *round nose* pliers make a loop at one end.
The loop should go in the opposite direction of the wire, so basically loop back on yourself. This also prevents the beads from falling off as you thread them onto the wire.

3. Prepare your bead order by laying them out first.

For each row lay out approximately 8 inches of beads. In this image example, the beads are laid out to create a graduated wave effect with larger bead groups followed by sections of smaller bead groups.



Tip: Use the smaller beads in the two outer rows, and save the larger beads for the middle rows.



4. Thread your beads onto the wire. Keep looking at each row as you go, this will help to decide the best bead order.

5. Once you get to the end of the wire, trim off the excess wire leaving just over a centimetre and again loop back with your *round nose* pliers to finish the end.



6. Pin and loop two beads and connect these to the loops at either end of the wire. This makes a great finish.



Notes:

Difficulty level – easy

Time to complete – 1.5 to 2 hours
