

Memory Wire Ring Kit



Contents:

- 1 spool memory wire
- 50 small grey glass pearl beads
- 30 x 3mm crystal AB bicone beads
- 10 wide seed beads
- 20 small green seed beads
- 5 large green seed beads
- 15 Swarovski 4mm bicone beads in silk & silver night
- 1 large Swarovski round faceted bead in turquoise
- 2 x large Swarovski crystal AB faceted beads
- 10 eye pins
- 10 jump rings



* Please note there are a few spare beads included

First cut the three wires for each ring:

- 1 memory wire coil loop, plus ½ inch over lap
- 2 memory wire coil loops plus ½ inch overlap
- 3 memory wire coil loops plus ½ inch overlap

Please note, you will require memory wire cutters to complete this project.

1. Start with making the 3 coil ring:

Take the 3 row coil you have cut and make a loop at one end using your *round nose pliers*.

The loop needs to go in the opposite direction of the wire (loop backward on itself)



TIP - as the ring memory wire is so thick and springy it can be easier to just open the coil, and place a couple of beads on first - this will leave the coil a little open so it is easier to make the loop.

Now decide how to place your beads along the wire.

You can make a pattern – for example 8 pearls, followed by small bicone, large bicone then small bicone and repeat.

You can make it random, you can make it so approximately 1 coil row is just pearl, the next row is just crystal then the third one just pearl to make a stripe effect.

Make sure you leave a good 1/4-1/2 inch at end so you can make another loop to finish the ring.

2. Next make the 2 coil ring:

Make a loop at one end as above, thread on your beads as above with a pattern or randomly.

In this images we have used all crystal AB bicone beads just more or less to the middle, then white seed beads and crystal – this way when you wear the ring it looks like a proper middle section. Finish with a loop at the other end as before.

Now make 3 dangles by placing two beads on a ball pin and looping.

Attach a jump ring to either end where you have made loops, on one place 2 dangles and on the other place one.



3. Finally, make the 1 coil ring:

As above, loop one end then thread beads on.

The one in this image is made by threading 1 turquoise bicone, 1 large acid green seed bead, followed by all small acid green seed beads, and then at the end one large one and one small turquoise bicone bead. Make another loop to finish.

Depending on how large you want your ring, join the end loops either with one or with 2 jump rings.



Now make 6 dangles (or make up to 8 of you want a very full cluster) by placing either 1 or two beads on a headpin and looping. Now attach one dangle directly to each end loop by opening and closing your loop. If you have just 1 connecting jump ring place all 4 remaining dangles to it. If you have 2 connecting jump rings attach either 2 or 3 dangles to each one. It is easier to attach them by opening the loop and not the jump rings connecting the memory wire.

Notes:

Difficulty level – medium

Time to complete – 1.5 to 2 hours
