

Briolette Bracelet Kit



Contents:


- 44 large briolette beads
- 1 small briolette bead for extender
- 45 head pins
- 50 x 0.5mm jump rings
- 22cm chain
- clasp

* Please note there are a few spare beads and jump rings included



Wire wrap all the beads as follows:

1. Thread a pin through a bead. Using *flat nose* pliers, bend the wire at a 90 degree angle leaving about a 0.5cm gap above the bead.




2. Place your *round nose* pliers on the bend and with your fingers wrap the wire round one end of the round nose pliers to make one loop.




3. Now remove and replace your pliers in the same place so that you can continue wrapping the wire around and underneath to form a 360 loop

4. Hold the wire loop with your *round nose* pliers with the wire length at 90 degrees, and grab the end of it with your flat nose pliers

5. Wrap around 3 times, you will find the wire bends at the end so you may have to release the pliers and re-grasp, don't worry this won't damage your coil.

6. After 3 loops, trim the wire and then tuck the end in between the bead and the bottom of your coil.

Repeat this process for all of the beads.

Assemble the bracelet:

1. Cut the chain into an 18cm length for the main body. Using a jump ring, connect the clasp to one end of the chain.



2. Cut another 5cm length to make your own extender chain.



Cut this 5cm length in two and join the two ends together again with a large jump ring in the middle to make extender chain.

Connect the extender to the main bracelet chain with a jump ring.

For a professional finish, also connect the small briolette bead to the very end of the extender.



3. Before you attach the beads to the chain, measure out the colour sections first. The diagram below shows the approximate lengths of each colour block section.





4. Connect each bead to the chain using a jump ring. Keep adding the beads to either side of the chain to build the cluster.

You will need to attach more than one bead per chain link.



Notes:
