

La vie en rose Necklace Kit



Contents:

- 12mm navy pearl x 4
- 12mm mink pearl x 6
- 12mm peach pearl x 4
- 12mm textured dark copper CCB x 4
- Semi precious faceted red jasper doughnut bead x 2
- Semi precious small pink rhodonite doughnut bead x 5
- 16mm half coat faceted pink bead x 1
- 12mm half coat faceted pink bead x 3
- 6mm hematite bicone bead x 3
- 11mm grey flat bead x 3
- 8mm silk clear globe bead x 6
- 6mm clear black diamond bead x 6
- End caps rose gold x 6
- Oval metal disc matt gunmetal x 2
- NM flower gunmetal x 1
- Antique copper clasp x 1
- Hammered hoop gunmetal x 1
- 6mm curb chain rose gold 22cm
- 3mm rope chain rose gold 18cm
- 10mm large curb chain rose gold 27cm
- Rose gold jump rings x 68
- Eye pins gunmetal x 47



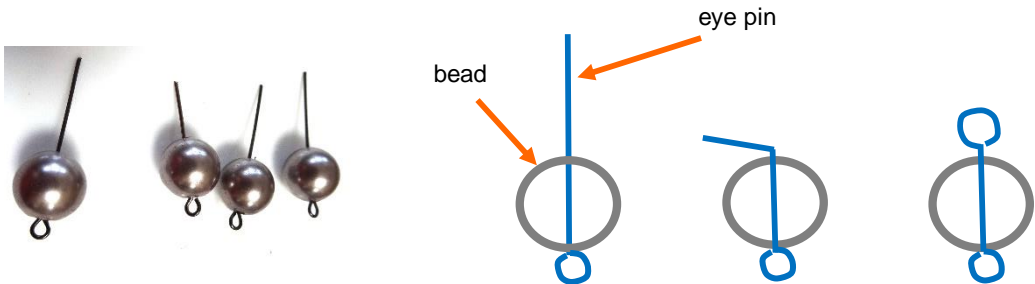
* Please note, there are a few spare pins and jump rings included and the chain lengths are slightly longer than required (apart from the heaviest chain which does not need to be amended).

1. Lay out the beads so you can see each group clearly.

Prepare the beads by pinning and looping all of them, and remember to use the end caps on some of the pearl beads as shown in step 2.

To prepare beads:

1. Insert the pin into the bead. Using flat nose pliers bend the pin to a 90 degree angle against the bead at the open end.
2. Trim the end of the pin to about 0.8 to 1cm length.
3. Use round nose pliers to loop the end of the pin, and close the loop.

2. There are 6 end caps that can be used with the pearl beads. In our example, we have used the caps on 4 navy pearl beads and two mink pearl beads.

Thread the end cap onto the eye pin first, then thread the bead on top of it before you bend and create a loop the other end of the pin.



3. Connect the non-pearl beads together using jump rings in between.

Tip: Connect the same shaped beads together first so that you create a number of sections, before attempting to link the whole necklace into one, long piece.



4. When connecting the metal castings together, use 3 jump rings in a row.

5. There are 3 types of chain used in this necklace.

Heavy curb chain – use as it is

Rope chain – cut into 3 sections of about 6cm

Light curb chain – cut into 2 sections of about 10cm



To make a double row effect with the light curb chain, fold one 10cm section over, and connect either end in between two bead sections. (The total length of this section will therefore be about 5cm).

The other two chain types should be used as single rows and connected at either end using jump rings.



6. Lay out each of your sections and connect them together once you are happy with the order. We recommend having bead sections in between chain sections, as shown in this example.

Remember to save the round metal hoop for the end so that it can be used to close the whole necklace with the clasp at the opposite end. Wear this as a necklace or a wrapped bracelet.

Notes:

Difficulty level – intermediate to advanced

Time to complete – 3 to 4 hours
